- 1. GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF TRADITIONAL ONONDAGA/ HAUDENOSAUNEE SYSTEM:
  - a. Same sovereign system in place for centuries, since well before European intervention
  - b. Oral system
  - c. Clans and Clan Mothers
  - d. Chiefs and Faithkeepers
  - e. Longhouse and ceremonies
  - f. No courts
  - g. No police, but:
    - i. Nation patrol
    - ii. Neighborhood watch
- 2. GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF DISPUTE RESOLUTION:
  - a. Community based
  - b. Begins in Clans, with Clan Mothers
  - c. "Using the good mind to work for a solution that benefits all"
  - d. If not resolved in Clans
    - i. Can be brought into the Longhouse
    - ii. Full opportunity for everyone to have their say
    - iii. Based upon holding individuals responsible

- 3. COOPERATION WITH OUTSIDE GOVERNMENTS:
  - a. Written agreement with Onondaga County Sheriff's Office since 1979
    - i. Tested and approved in US District Court
    - ii. Sheriffs do not come onto the territory unless:
      - (1) Invited by a Chief, of
      - (2) Life threatening situation
    - iii. Has worked well and to both parties' satisfaction
  - b. Arrangement with local Onondaga Town Court:
    - i. Written forms used to refer cases into court; and
    - Cases can be taken out of court and returned to the Nation; based upon individual's acceptance of responsibility and authority of Nation
- 4. *46 Buffalo Law Review 1011*, 1998:
  - Generally on the 1997 State Trade and Commerce
    Agreement, relative to excise taxes
  - b. Section II (a) (1) through (3), pages 1022 through 1026 has a brief description of various, non-traditional Native governments within New York boundaries.
